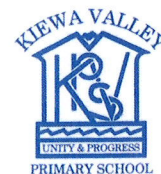

*The Tree Works have been completed - thank you to McLeod's Trees who did a great job in working with us to reduce the impact to student play areas.*

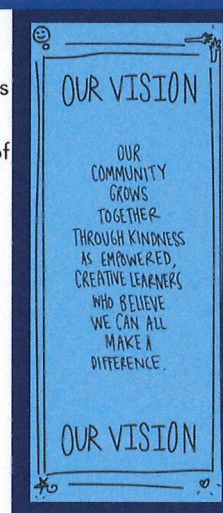
### DIVISION SWIMMING EVENTS:

### ATTENDANCE NUMBERS: EVERY DAY COUNTS

This weeks review of our attendance numbers have indicated that **ONLY 70% or 95 students** have been present at school for **95% or more of the time**. Our goal is finish the year on at least 85% of our students at 95% attendance or higher. **YOU MUST** communicate with **myself and the classroom teacher** if you are **planning a family holiday during the school term**. Whilst we understand that medical appointments and illness play a part, it is important that for the social and emotional and learning development of your child/ren they are given every opportunity to engage and thrive in their learning. On the following page I have an overview of our performance on NAPLAN - 85% of our students were here 95% of the time I can only imagine how much we as a school would be outperforming other schools. If your child is finding attending school difficult, either separating in the morning or having issues whilst at school and you would like some support please reach out the classroom teacher or myself. There are many strategies and supports we can put in place. We can only put strategies in place and support if we know about them. And whilst every morning we check in with all of our students to gauge their wellbeing, if they are not here we do not have this chance.

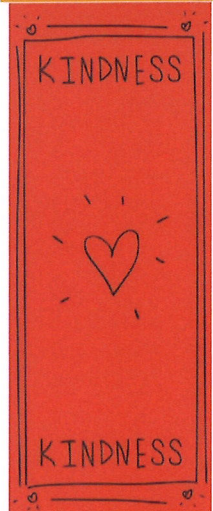
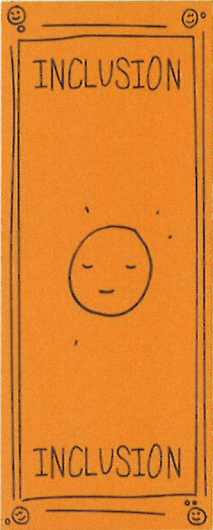
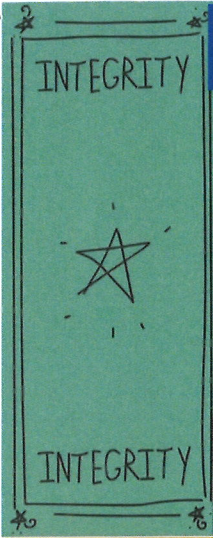
# HIGH PERFORMING LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

While NAPLAN is only one assessment measure of student outcomes I have always valued it to measure the growth of all students that is NOT cohort specific. More of an indication of the quality of teaching and learning as a whole. Recently I had my contract renewal meeting with the Department of Education and during my analysis of the school performance and therefore my performance over the period of 5 years I was looking for additional data to have a deep understanding of our academic growth over time.

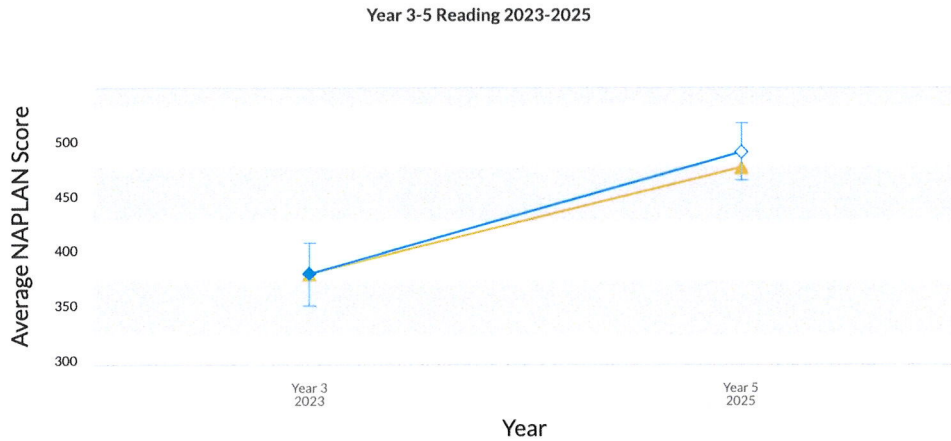
Below is a set of graphs I located on the My Schools website (see descriptions below). **Student progress:**

The blue line shows how the school's students have improved since they did NAPLAN two years ago. The yellow line shows the improvement by other Australian students with the same starting score and similar background. Select 'All Australian students' to see a grey line showing the improvement of all Australian students.

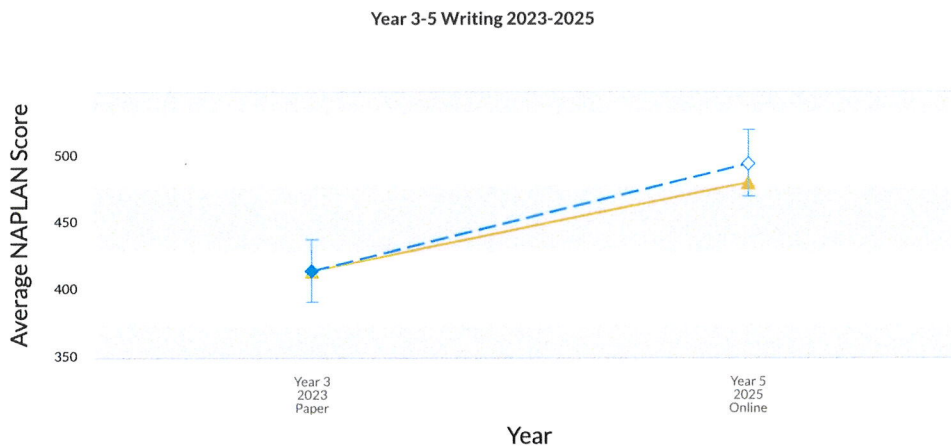

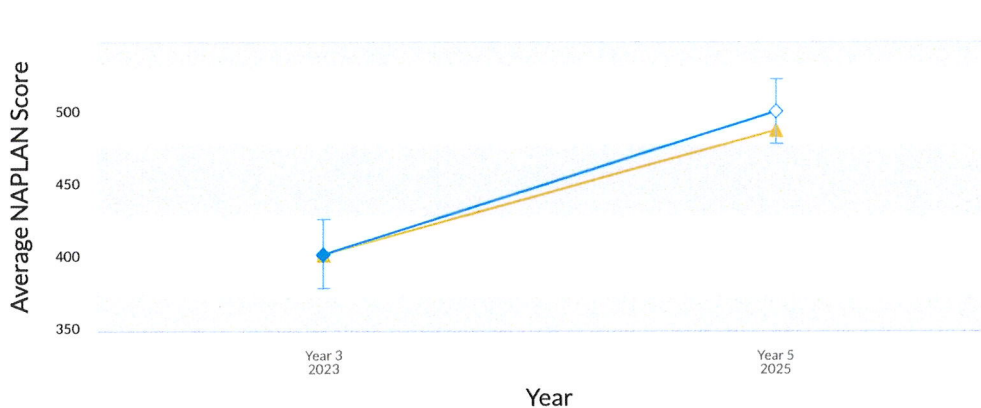
Year 3-5 Reading 2023-2025

Our students have outperformed other students across all three areas of Reading, Writing and Numeracy between 2023 and 2025. This is another measure that just indicates the quality of teaching and learning across all classrooms in our school.

My goal has always been to reduce variance in classrooms and ensure high quality teaching. The three improvement strategies that have enabled this success is our structure of

**Collaborative Planning** along with **investing in inclusive practices**

- **ensuring the learning needs are met of every child** through the expertise of Ms Grogan.

Whilst we also offer a robust intervention program, which means those students who may be behind are being caught up

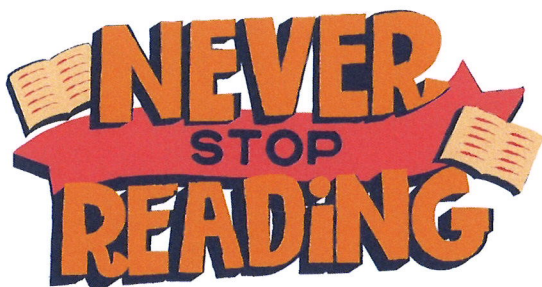


## 160 Nights of Reading and Attendance Award

Each year every student who has read for at least 160 nights will receive a certificate and a free book. Please remember the importance of hearing your child read every night. There is strong connection amongst years of research that say if a child's reading ability (accuracy, fluency and comprehension) is high their overall academic performance is improved. If your child is NOT bringing home a reader every night - please chat to the class teacher about this. To keep the momentum of reading nightly on our students radars we do have a reading award at assembly. Every week your child reads for at least 5 nights - they will get a raffle ticket in the whole school draw. Once again to be drawn out students need to be present at Assembly.

We also have an Attendance Award at every assembly. There are two requirements to be in the running for the attendance award:

1. 95% attendance for the month and 2. Ensure you are at school on the day of Assembly to be in the draw to win. Ms Grogan will gift the lucky winners a Kmart Voucher.

**This is for effective traffic movement and the safety of all.**

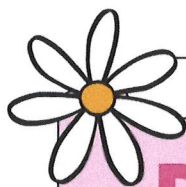
# Wellbeing Dog – Dogs Connect Program

Last Friday, all students gathered together to learn about our new wellbeing dog, Daisy. There was also a student Q&A, with many thoughtful and curious questions asked. While Daisy will not be officially onsite this term, as we continue preparing our community, she may occasionally visit the office so she can gradually become familiar with the environment. There were certainly plenty of “awwws” and giggles when students saw photos of Daisy settling in at home, and we hope your child/ren came home feeling excited.

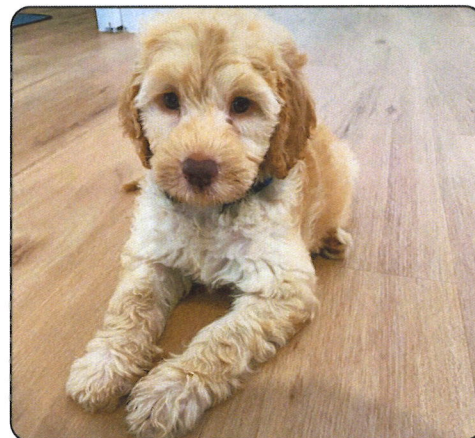
Updates will continue to be shared through the newsletter, so please keep an eye out for further information. I will also be available at the fete to chat with families about Daisy and the Dogs Connect program.

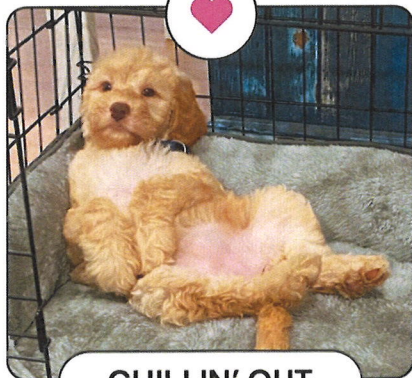

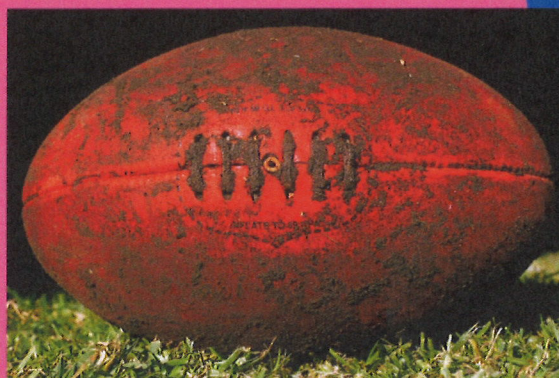
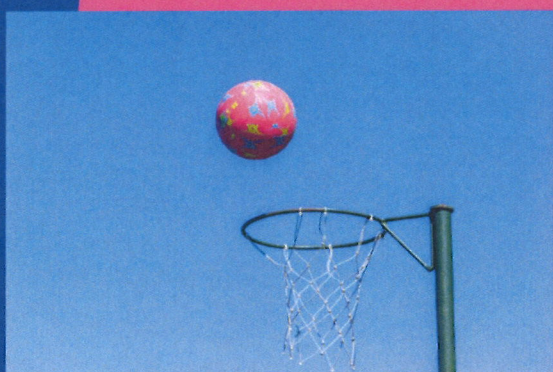
