
to SHARE as we want to reduce FOOD WASTE. Parents and Carers can join us and we will move indoors if the weather is unfriendly.




ART NEWS

This semester students have been having lots of fun making things in our Art Classes. Art Clubs run during Thursday lunch where students can have a free choice in their art project.

Grades 4/5A, 5/6A and 5/6L have been making a First Nations picture and preparing a Stringart Planet artwork. In the First Nation's picture, there is a silhouette of an Australian animal placed in the middle. Warm colours radiate from the animal with First Nation symbols to represent the student and their animal choice. You can see Mackenzie here showing her fantastic piece.

Grades 2/3B and 3/4J are making wire sculptures and learning all about the Tree of Life' archetype or sacred tree which is found in almost all cultures across the world. They have also studied the Australian artist, Robert Klippel, as their sculpture was originally inspired by his work.

1/2E has had a very busy and fun Term 2!



We went on our first school excursion for our Integrated Studies topic; Food and Fibre. We went to Wolki Farm and Roman's Diary. From our excursion and with our in-class learning, we have learnt where our clothes come from and where our food comes from before it arrives at the supermarket.



We even got to practise making some clothes by knitting and crocheting with wool with the help from Mrs Litchfield's mum, Alys, and Swayze's grandmother, Fiona.



In Literacy, we have been learning how to write a speech and what makes good public speakers. We have practised reading books to our partners showing good body language, making eye contact, projecting our voice and reading at a good speed. This has helped build our confidence with presenting and develop our reading fluency too. We will put this into practise next week when we read our speeches to the whole class.

We have enjoyed using the balance scales to explore the mass of objects around the classroom and compare them. We have also learnt more about 2D and 3D shapes and expanded our vocabulary to describe the shapes using their features. We enjoyed using classroom materials, playdough and geoboards to make 2D and 3D shapes and we also

watched tutorials online on how to draw 3D shapes and how to draw 2D shapes to make different animals.


