The other positive has been their ability to explain their learning, what they are learning and why they are learning it. We certainly have come a long way in our teaching of mathematics in a very short time.

Scott Walker will be joining our teaching team from Tallangatta Primary School for 2024 and 2025. Scott comes to us with expert teaching skills. He will be the Maths and Science Learning Specialist, which will further strengthen our teaching of maths. Scott has completed professional learning in SWPBS and Primary Maths Specialist and will complement our staff development and strengthen our teams. Scott will work directly with staff in peer observations and coaching and I am so excited to be finally able to get this component of staff learning off the ground. Scott has also demonstrated a strong commitment to community which is so important to KVPS.

On Friday 13th October, the Grade 3 – 6 students participated in an event organised by the Indigo Shire to celebrate, 'This Girl Can' Week.



Tutor Learning Initiative TERM 4 UPDATE

This term we have another round of tutoring in place. We have looked at our students and their data across Reading, Writing and Maths and have organised new target groups to support their learning. If your child is involved in the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) this term, you will have received a letter of notification with the subject area.

As we are investing additional money into the program we have been able to support a wide range of students. Our tutoring program is not just for students working below expected level, we are also working with students who may not have shown as much growth as we would expect in the past 6 months and others who need a boost either in confidence or a certain skill set.

Of course, we would love to be able to support each and every student through the program, however the benefits do flow on to all students. When Laurie or myself are working with students in a small targeted group, the classroom teacher works with other students in the room in another targeted group or 1:1 as needed.

Our ES staff are also in classrooms supporting students and Donna provides Sounds Write and Reading intervention in addition to the TLI.

As the letter sent home stated, please feel free to contact me if you would like further information about your child's current involved in the program. Your child's classroom teacher can also provide further details of their learning and how you can support them further at home.
