STRENGTH SURVEY REMINDER:



Hi From the Art Room ...

All the students have been very busy this term exploring the art elements of colour and value. Grades F/1 have finished their oil pastel wash artwork of themselves, 2/3 have been learning about colour in readiness for their Monet interpretation, 4/5 are sketching pears and Grade 6 are learning about colour in readiness to make their own abstract painting on a canvas.

It is great to see all the students coming in with art smocks of their own, please write their names in large letters as smocks get easily mixed-up with the art room supply. The smocks will have paint on them by the end of the year - so don't worry about writing directly onto the material near the neckline. Art smocks can be sourced from many shops or family member cupboards such as Mum or Dad's old shirts. Don't forget that tying a bow at the back is a difficult skill for young children and long sleeves are best to cover jumpers when the cooler weather arrives.

If your child should accidently have acrylic paint splashed onto their clothing, try this washing technique below. Remember to only wash in cold water.

- 1. In a bucket, dissolve a generous cup of soap flakes (can use baby wash soap flakes) in a small amount of hot water.
- 2. Pour cold water over the dissolved soap flakes so that the soapy water feels completely cold. (Do not put item in either warm or hot water ONLY COLD water).
- Soak item overnight in this mix.
- 4. Use a dish washing brush to remove any acrylic paint flakes from the material.
- 5. In the washing machine, wash item in a cold water wash with your regular laundry powder.

Please note that black is very hard to remove completely and this technique only works for the first wash and is not a guaranteed method of removing the paint.

As materials in art can be expensive, we always welcome any spare craft materials that you feel are not necessary at home and would love to have old newspapers as these are very helpful with painting.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank all contributors of these donations for the art room. Thank you for the egg cartons dropped at my front door!
