PRINCIPAL UPDATE:

MOBILE PHONES and SMART WATCHES

Last week I attended an Area Principal meeting in which the Deputy Secretary again reinforced the importance of schools upholding the Ministerial Order for the State Government. To avoid us having to enforce the order can I please ask ALL PARENTS and CARERS to again explain to their child/ren the importance of handing their PHONES and SMART WATCHES to the Office upon arrival at school and then collect again at the end of the day. I will be putting together a flyer over the coming days which explains the key messaging in the policy and order from the Government.

PUBLIC SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS:

At the Principal meeting last week David Howes, Deputy Secretary of the Department of Education shared with us staggering results of Public Schools at the VCE level. 10 Public Secondary or P12 Colleges had scored the same VCE scores as some of the most elite Non-Government Schools. 6 of these were rural Secondary Schools, performing the same as Wesley College, Xavier College, Melbourne Girls Grammar and Scotch College. Now this is extremely impressive but what stood out for me was the important role public education plays in supporting your child/ren to achieve their dreams no matter what they are. Whether that's a trade, the forces, police person or heading off to University. Our aim at Kiewa Valley Primary School is always to support the education of your child so they have an excellent foundation and understanding of their learning so they can achieve their goals. Be resilient and show perseverance in learning and be kind and respectful community members, which are inclusive of all. CONT.

SWPBS UPDATE (School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support)




At the end of Week 4, we can see that 'Integrity' is ahead in the token tubes. Another great reminder of how amazing our students are at KVPS.

BREAKFAST CLUB


Just a reminder about Breakfast Club, particularly for our new families. On Friday mornings we offer a selection of toast, fruit and yoghurt served from the canteen.

Numeracy at Home

We use numeracy everyday. There are so many incidental ways that we can incorporate it into our daily routines. Below are some great ways you can support your child's understanding of numeracy in real world contexts.

Are We There Yet? (Foundation - Grade 2)

- · Mark important dates on a calendar
- · Discuss what time you should start getting ready
- · Time how long it takes to travel to different locations
- · Estimate how long it takes you to:
 - · brush your teeth?
 - o drive to the store?
 - o get dressed?
 - o jump up and down 10 times?
- Investigate how long it is to your children's birthdays (in months, weeks, days or hours)
- List your daily schedule. What time do you get up? What time do you go to school?





Are We There Yet? (Grade 3 - 6)

- · Collect important dates and mark them on a calendar
- · Time how long does it take us to travel to school
- Estimate how far you've travelled, the distance to your destination,
 and how long it is going to take
- Find the arrival time: e.g. If it is 4:38 pm now and it will take us 15 minutes to get there
- Enter dates into a digital calendar: e.g., identify the day of the week, the time between dates and set reminders
- · Help to make a travel plan using timetables
- · Read the public transport maps to follow along with each stop


We will also be running our working bee during this event. If you would like to participate bring along some gardening gloves. We will be weeding, mulching, preparing the beds and planting new plants.


